VISION OF THE SDGS

- End poverty in all its forms everywhere.
- Achieve peaceful, just, and inclusive societies.
- Ensure that economic, environmental, and social progress will be sustainable.

NATIONAL STRATEGIES

Cohesive nationally owned sustainable development strategies, supported by integrated national financing frameworks, will be at the heart of our efforts. We reiterate that each country has primary responsibility for its own economic and social development and that the role of national policies and development strategies cannot be overemphasized.

BUSAN PRINCIPLES

- Ownership of development priorities by developing countries
- Focus on results
- Inclusive development partnerships
- Mutual transparency and accountability

BUSAN VISION

- Development is driven by strong, sustainable and inclusive growth.
- Governments' own revenues play a greater role in financing development needs, with greater accountability to citizens for results.
- Effective state and non-state institutions design and implement their own ,reforms and hold each other to account.
- Developing countries integrate regionally and globally, create economies of scale, compete in the global economy.

DDD PRINCIPLES

- Focus on solving local problems as defined and refined by local people
- Legitimize reforms at all levels, building ownership and momentum
- Work with conveners who mobilize stakeholders to tackle common problems and address change
- Blend design and implementation through rapid cycles of planning, action, reflection, and revision
- Manage risk by making small bets
- Foster solutions that have real impact, build trust, empower people, and promote sustainability.
